Coil Construction busy with mid-Missouri projects

COLUMBIA, MO (April 8, 2009) — Coil Construction, Inc., is busy working on construction projects in the mid-Missouri area this spring, including a food pantry for the Central Missouri Food Bank, a restaurant attached to the Hampton Inn & Suites near campus and an urgent care center.

Central Missouri Food Bank Pantry

Coil Construction is renovating the former Maaco Auto Body, located at 1007 Big Bear Boulevard near Rangeline Road, for the Central Missouri Food Bank. The 14,500 square foot building will include office, food product and storage areas, and will serve as a pantry to provide free food and grocery items to needy recipients in the area.

The food bank has been looking for a larger pantry location for four years, said executive director Peggy Kirkpatrick, to meet its growing needs from serving 9,000 individuals a month.

"The Central Missouri Food Bank has enjoyed a long partnership with Coil Construction," Kirkpatrick said. "Coil has been generous in their service, donations and expertise."

Coil previously renovated the Food Bank's current location on Vandiver Drive. The new pantry is scheduled for completion in July.

Stadium Grill restaurant

Coil also is beginning construction on the new Stadium Grill restaurant located at the Hampton Inn & Suites at the University of Missouri. The 5,000 square foot restaurant is designed to blend in with the Hampton Inn's exterior finishes and will feature a separate unique arched entrance.

Hampton Inn & Suites owner David Parnley is excited to bring the restaurant to Columbia and to create a new destination for University of Missouri supporters. Parnley has contracted Ted Geiger and Chris LaRocca, two industry veterans, to develop and



operate Stadium Grill. The restaurant will feature a state-of-the art viewing environment for sporting events, with more than 30 LCD televisions. Stadium Grill also will serve signature burgers, including a Tiger Challenge Burger that is free to anyone who can finish it.

Completion of the restaurant is scheduled for August.

Providence Urgent Care

The former Woods Auto Gallery, at 202 E. Nifong, is being renovated by Coil Construction and will become Providence Urgent Care.

The mission of the urgent care center, established by board certified emergency medicine physicians, is to provide high quality acute care less expensively and faster than an emergency room. The center will treat all non-life or limb threatening injuries and illnesses. Providence Urgent Care will offer pre-employment physicals, DOT physicals, drug screens and workers' comp evaluations.

Peak Performance Physical Therapy and Sports Medicine also will be part of the facility.

Coil Construction specializes in institutional, retail, professional and industrial construction throughout the Midwest, with an emphasis on construction projects in Missouri.
